The Wales TUC is working in social partnership with Welsh Government to make Wales a fair work nation – with the extension of collective bargaining and union representation at the heart of delivery.

In May 2019 a report by the independent Fair Work Commission was published in Wales, having been commissioned by Welsh Government. The task of the Commission was to make evidence-based recommendations to promote and encourage fair work. Evidence put to that Commission included policy ideas currently being developed by the Institute of Employment Rights around a Manifesto for Labour Law and reflected in long established policy of the Wales TUC.

This meeting will update us on the IER manifesto, the TUC great jobs agenda and the work that the Wales TUC is undertaking with Welsh government to ensure that fair work through social partnership is delivered for workers throughout Wales.

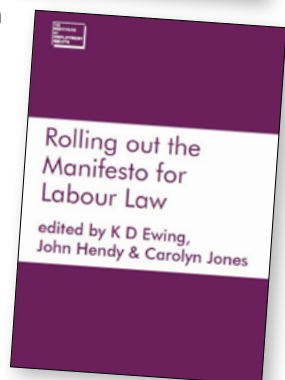
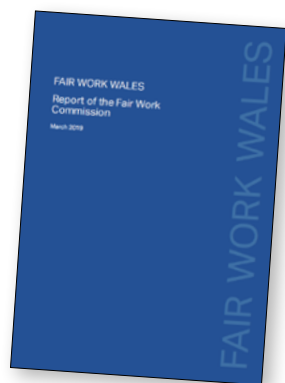
